Major Area Attractions

Empire State Building

The Empire State Building stands out as the most recognizable part of NYC's skyline and is the city's most famous building thanks to its many features in film and television. As a popular tourist destination, more than four million annual visitors travel up its elevators to look out over the sprawling metropolis.

Madison Sauare Garden

Dubbed "The World's Most Famous Arena," MSG is home to the New York Knicks (NBA), New York Rangers (NHL), and is the busiest music arena in North America. With a seating capacity of nearly 21,000, The Garden plays host to a constant slew of high-profile events attracting New Yorkers and visitors alike.

New York University

NYU is the largest independent research university in the nation and sits at the border of the trendy NoHo and Greenwich Village neighborhoods. With an annual enrollment of more than 100,000 students, the university is one of the top institutions for future finance, tech, and science professionals. Among their long list of famous alums are politicians and Hollywood icons like Ursula Burns, Alan Greenspan, Bill de Blasio, Lady Gaga, Donald Glover, Idina Menzel, Spike Lee, Martin Scorsese, and many others.

Herald Square

This popular spot in Midtown is formed by the intersection of Broadway and 6th Avenue. Visited by nearly 2 million people each year, the square is surrounded by popular shopping like Macy's flagship store and the world's largest Victoria's Secret store. Herald Square also serves as the terminus for the cherished Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade.

Hotels



- Gemma, Zero-Bond, Il Buco, Bar Primi, Jolene, The Nines, Temple Bar, Jac's on Bond, Lafeyette... all of NYC's hard-toget-in venues are right here, and frequented by celebrities
- · Catch the luxury shoppers, gym junkies, nightlife crowds, and NYU students in the area, or as they pass by on their way to the West Village, Greenwich Village and Washington Square Park, or streaming up Bowery through the heart of the East Village



WALLSCAPE

West 29th Street & 6th Avenue

- With an imposing vertical presence, this wallscape looms over the congestion where 6th Ave meets 29th in Chelsea, one of NYC's more dense and high-traffic neighborhoods. Routinely backed up, 29th funnels towards the iconic Madison Square Garden, home to the Knicks and Rangers and 20,000 fans attending 320+ annual events
- The crowds passing are significant due to notable neighbors including the country's #1 busiest rail hub, Penn Station, and #1 largest department store, Macy's in Herald Square. This unit captures a broad audience of locals, commuters and tourists
- A plethora of stylish hotels including the Ace, the Moxy and the Virgin are steps away, and the trendy Fashion Institute of Technology, keeps the area action-packed
- Did we mention it also peers directly into the Kimpton's stylish event space, SECOND, and Skirt Steak right below draws lines out the door thanks to going viral on TikTok?



WALLSCAPE

West 36th Street & 8th Avenue

- Don't underestimate the power of a 76-foot wallscape at the exit from NYC's Lincoln Tunnel. Standing over 8th Ave, sandwiched between Port Authority and Penn Station, the traffic at this location is relentless. Millions spill out from the #1 busiest train station in America, where NJTransit, Amtrak and the LIRR terminate, garnering this unit 1M+ total imps per week
- Turn right and you'll see Madison Square Garden just a couple of blocks down. The iconic venue hosts 20,000 fans at a time for 320+ annual events, and sits above one of the New York City subway's busiest stations - 34th street
- Traffic inching by this wallscape is also headed across to Herald Square, or over to the recently developed Hudson Yards neighborhood - dense with high-rise luxury apartments, high-end retail, notable restaurants, and attractions like the Vessel and High Line. Herald Square, one of NYC's busiest intersections after Times Square, is home to America's largest department store, Macy's Herald Square, and a plethora of retail atop yet another swarming subway station



WALLSCAPE (HANDPAINT)

Spring Street & Mercer Street

- This hand-painted wallscape is in the heart of SoHo, the most vibrant and iconic retail shopping district in NYC, possibly even the country, and is one of the only OOH opportunities in this chic, trendy area packed with fashionistas, artists, young professionals, and celebrities
- Towering above copious designer boutiques, high-end restaurants, galleries, exclusive nightclubs, luxury co-ops, and coffee shops, this unit calls to pedestrians crowding the sidewalks heading west on Spring St or north to Prince





WALLSCAPE

Broadway and W 27th St

- If you want to reach the stylish, active, upwardly-mobile young professionals ie. quintessential New Yorker, this is your spot. Unmissable at the street-level, this 6-story Flatiron wallscape towers over the sidewalk on Broadway - a uniquely low-hung structure with an imposing presence that is hard to come by in Manhattan
- In recent years, Broadway in NoMad has become a dining destination of its own, with tables spilling out of the packed restaurants onto the pedestrian-heavy thoroughfare known as the "NoMad Piazza"
- Not only does this wallscape have an incredible read up Broadway and over the 28th St subway, but it also captures the scene surrounding three of Manhattan's most stylish hotels: The Ned NoMad, the Ritz Carlton, and The Ace
- Other notable neighbors among many include Sweetgreen SoulCycle, Eataly, KazuNori, Oscar Wilde, Museum of Sex, 230 Fifth, and of course Madison Square Park with some of the best views of the Empire State Building





BROOKLYN NEW YORK

As NYC's most populous borough, Brooklyn is known for its diversity, vibrant art scene, distinct neighborhoods, and influence on culture and entertainment. Over 2.6 million residents and 61,000 businesses attribute to its pulsing economy, and the Brooklyn Tech Triangle is home to more than 1,300 innovative companies causing the area to be a hotspot for software and tech-savvy professionals. Pro sports are part of Brooklyn's fabric again as the NBA's Net's and WNBA's Liberty play at Barclays Center, which also draws crowds for concerts and conventions. New York residents and visitors also flock to the borough's southern shore to visit popular destinations like Coney Island, Manhattan Beach, Brighton Beach, and the New York Aquarium. Amidst Brooklyn's wide range of attractions, are all sorts of hidden gems, as it has become a trendsetter for arts and culture. This bustling community is brimming with live music venues such as Brooklyn Bowl, great shopping at places like Fulton Mall, and world-class cuisine.

Major Area Attractions

Barclays Center

Home to the NBA's Nets and WNBA's Liberty, this 19,000-seat stadium also hosts A-list concerts for stars like Jay-Z, Beyonce, Rihanna, the Rolling Stones, Paul McCartney, Bruce Springsteen, and many others.

Prospect Park

This 526-acre park attracts nearly 10 million annual visitors and was laid out by the same designers responsible for Manhattan's Central Park. In addition to being a high-functioning green space, Prospect Park also contains a zoo, ice rink, Brooklyn's only lake, and other athletic facilities.

Smorgasburg

The largest weekly open-air food market in America attracts nearly 30,000 people each weekend, with over 100 local vendors serving their specialties to patrons. Split over two days each, Smorgasburg operates on the Williamsburg Waterfront on Saturdays and Prospect Park on Sundays.

Atlantic Terminal

As a hub for NYC's subway, Atlantic Terminal sees daily ridership of nearly 30,000 travelers. The station is located across the street from Barclays Center and connects to a mall with popular stores like Target, Bath & Body Works, and Uniqlo.

Local Destinations

Bars & Restaurants

A culinary magnet within NYC, Brooklyn offers tons of dining options, including local favorites like Emmy Squared, Peter Luger Steak House, Paulie Gee's, Westlight (in the William Vale), Milk Bar Williamsburg, and DUMBO (SoHo) House.

Retail & Boutiques

With no shortage of shopping, Brooklyn boasts several large retail complexes and boutique destinations like City Point BKLYN, Fulton Mall, Atlantic Terminal Mall, and Grand Street, all of which feature popular stores like Sephora, Uniqlo, Supreme, Target, and Macy's.

Hotels



Van Brunt Street & Verona Street

- At the entryway to Red Hook, on the neighborhood's primary thoroughfare, Van Brunt, this eye-level streetscape is hard to miss for New Yorkers heading into the area--particularly those visiting the famous RH Lobster Pound next door
- A diverse neighborhood, with a mix of residential and industrial real estate, Red Hook is where new Brooklyn meets old Brooklyn; Formula-e, Tesla, IKEA, and luxury housing, alongside historic brownstones, craftspeople, gallerists and traditional Italian institutions
- · Van Brunt St is the core of the neighborhood's vibrant arts and culture scene, with numerous galleries and showrooms, as well as restaurants that serve more as hangout destinations for the crowds of New Yorkers who flood the area in the summer
- · Red Hook is fueled by its large outdoor restaurants, bars and breweries, namely Brooklyn Crab, Hometown BBQ, Red Hook Tavern, Delfontes, Sixpoint Brewery, Strong Rope Brewery, Keg & Lantern and Sunny's



Bedford Avenue & Atlantic Avenue

- This proud wallscape stands tall over the jam-packed intersection of Bedford and Atlantic Avenues, two of BK's most recognizable street names. Bedford funnels bricked traffic all the way into Williamsburg, while Atlantic takes traffic 1 mile to Barclays Center and into Manhattan
- Where Bed-Stuy meets Crown Heights, a rapidly gentrifying pocket of Brooklyn, this ideal location captures three lanes of northbound traffic, plus pedestrians coming from the rail and subway transit hub at Nostrand Ave Station
- Bed-Stuy is home to a mix of artists, musicians, hipsters, and young families with a strong sense of community; it is well-known for its Black cultural roots and diverse food and drink scene. Notable neighbors include The Fly, A&A, Shake Shack, Endless Life Brewing, David's Brisket House, Ursula Brooklyn, Doris, Bad Luck Bar, Planet Fitness, Blink, CubeSmart and the Brooklyn Children's Museum



WALLSCAPE

Myrtle Avenue & Walworth Street

- This Bed-Stuy facade looks down Myrtle Ave, a major thoroughfare in this rapidly gentrifying neighborhood. A truly local scene, Bed-Stuy is where you'll find real New Yorkers engaging in the area's significant culture and arts scene. Surrounded by walk-ups, airy lofts, coffee shops, restaurants and bars, this unit is at the center of this historic community
- Myrtle carries vehicle traffic toward Broadway at the intersection of Bushwick where it meets the busy Myrtle station of the JMZ train. This tall, vertical wallscape perches on the corner of Walworth just ahead of the Nostrand Ave intersection - another major artery in the area. The right-hand read captures movement eastbound en route to The Home Depot, which in NYC, is truly a destination of its own
- · Close to the Pratt Institute, art and design students and graduates live alongside young professionals and creatives in Bed-Stuy, who gather together at places like For All Good Things, Shipwreck Seafood Boutique, Dept of Culture, Fan-Fan Doughnuts, The Bishop, and 750 Myrtle Diner





Seigel Street & Bogart Street

- One of several OBM wallscapes within these few blocks where Bushwick meets Williamsburg, this illuminated wallscape sits right alongside the Morgan Ave L-train subway entrance. The L is notoriously crowded serving as the primary mode of transport to and from Manhattan
- This unit is right where the area's heaviest day-to-day foot traffic is found, just a block from the original Roberta's pizza shop, a destination of its own
- The gritty, industrial area is a nightlife mecca, and houses premium events spaces, creative studios, chic home renovation showrooms, vintage stores, and dozens of restaurants and bars incl. Ichiran, Otis, Bunna Cafe, Semkeh, Pine Box Rock Hall, The Narrows and Syndicated Bar
- The nonstop crowd in this area above Flushing Ave, where Bushwick begins, is comprised of young professionals, creatives, wealthy residents and "hipsters" --aka the perfect segment of trend-setter Brooklynites





- This high-impact unit sits on Morgan Ave, where the gritty nightlife district of East Williamsburg converges with bustling Bushwick. Specifically, this wallscape is on the exterior of the multi-level music venue and bar, Our Wicked Lady
- The streetscape faces northbound vehicular traffic flowing up Morgan Ave from Bushwick, merging traffic coming up Knickerbocker and Wilson Aves - both significant corridors in this enclave of creative professionals
- This wallscape is en route to Netflix studios, which is just around the corner, alongside several major event venues including Future Space, The Meadows and Brooklyn Monarch

- This dynamic Bushwick location, lined with art galleries, hip bars, and thrift shops amid industrial grit and colorful street art, is just one block away from the foodie favorite, Roberta's, named one of "The Absolute Best Restaurants in Bushwick" by New York Magazine

- · This enormous wallscape is close to cobblestone crossstreets, brick townhomes, and a Citi Bike station, halfway between Hometown Bar-B-Que, NYC's best barbecue joint, and Baked NYC, made famous for their brownies
- This impressive, right-hand read captures northeast traffic along Red Hook's main thoroughfare coming from NYC's 346,000- flagship IKEA store and its waterfront park, Food Bazaar supermarket, Red Hook Winery, Sixpoint Brewery, Chelsea Garden Center, and Pioneer Works Art Center
- Chic restaurants, boutiques, art galleries, and trendy dive bars line Van Brunt connecting the revitalized waterfront with foodies, hipsters, artists, and loyal regulars to frequent neighborhood favorites, the Brooklyn Crab with outdoor views of New York Harbor and Sunny's Bar with a lively dance scene



Johnson Avenue & Scott Avenue

- This massive wallscape towers over Johnson Ave, nextdoor to one of NYC's most famous party venues, Elsewhere, a 24,000 sq ft multi-room space serving as a beacon to New Yorkers and Brooklynites seeking out the area's renowned art and music scene, aka trend-setters
- Beaming clear to Flushing Ave where it meets Cypress, two of Bushwick's primary thoroughfares, this impactful unit captures constant traffic heading toward Williamsburg
- This area where Bushwick meets East Williamsburg is a mix of warehouse spaces transformed into event spaces, nightclubs, notable culinary destinations and a network of art and design studios. Notably, this wallscape impacts crowds headed up Scott Ave toward New York City's largest club and music venue, Avant Gardner, home of Brooklyn Mirage
